We are thrilled to share the V Foundation for Cancer Research 2024 Annual Report, which highlights a year of extraordinary progress in our mission to achieve Victory Over Cancer®.

More than 30 years ago, Jim Valvano delivered an unforgettable speech at the 1993 ESPY Awards. In a moment that continues to inspire millions, he announced the creation of the V Foundation.

Our organization is built on a simple yet profound mission: to fund game-changing research and all-star scientists to accelerate Victory Over Cancer[®] and save lives. Motivated by his own battle with cancer, Jim understood the urgent need for breakthroughs. Since then, the V Foundation has invested nearly \$400 million into cutting-edge cancer research, empowering leading scientists and rising stars to push boundaries and drive lifesaving discoveries.

This year, we set a record by granting \$44 million to 76 cancer research teams. From addressing cancer disparities through the Stuart Scott Memorial Cancer Research Fund to the creation of groundbreaking partnerships, the V Foundation will continue to have a positive impact on patients for generations to come.

V Foundation: Proven, Positive Impact.

There are **18.1 million cancer survivors**

in the U.S. today (5.4% of the population). The number of cancer survivors is projected to increase by 24.4% to 22.5 million by 2032, 26 million by 2040.

We are in full acceleration mode. In the last four years alone, we've generated 34% of our total grant award funding

across our 31-year history, allowing us to accelerate breakthroughs and save lives faster than ever before.

Researchers funded by the V Foundation have collectively, throughout their careers, been connected to

over 1,000 clinical trials

and have received **over 5,500 additional grants**

that have generated over \$20 billion in additional research dollars.

2024 Highlights: **Record Numbers, New Partnerships**

A peak year for the **Stuart Scott Memorial Cancer Research Fund**, which addresses racial disparities in cancer outcomes and supports general cancer research led by scientists from underrepresented groups.

In the past year, the fund granted **\$3.6 million**, including an award to Elizabeth Wasmuth, Ph.D., who was named the Abeloff V Scholar, which designates the highest rated V Scholar proposal of the year from the V Foundation's Scientific Advisory Committee.



FIGHT FOR Mc and Brett Ari and Chaser Colin Schler Cancer thrive Last season. **Hockey Fights** Cancer, an NHL and NHLPA initiative to unite the hockey community in the fight against cancer, celebrated its 25th anniversary with a record-breaking fundraising year. Hockey Fights Cancer Powered by the V Foundation raised over **\$4 million**, with \$2.9 million going to groundbreaking cancer research through the V Foundation, funding 10 grants across the U.S. and Canada.

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2024 Highlights: **Record Numbers, New Partnerships**

The V Foundation has awarded **over \$91 million** in pediatric cancer research grants, including 11 grants (over \$7 million) in 2023-2024. **Nearly \$93 million** has been raised for pediatric cancer research since the inception of the Dick Vitale Gala, with a recordbreaking **\$24.8 million** raised in 2024. This encompasses millions raised during the Gala, including a **\$12 million** gift from Mark and Cindy Pentecost, founders of IT WORKS!

The V Foundation, Dolphins Cancer Challenge (DCC) and Sylvester Comprehensive Cancer Center committed to a collective \$10-year, \$30 million investment dedicated to game-changing cancer research, representing the largest fundraising partnership in the history of the V Foundation.



V Foundation Research is Making a Difference

Daniel Blanco-Melo, Ph.D., a virologist by trade, and his team at Fred Hutchinson Cancer Center are taking an outside-thebox approach to cancer research. As a virologist, he's researching how 'viral fossils', once considered junk DNA, if turned on could prevent and fight cancer cells. The hope of his project is to help design new treatment options

by taking advantage of the potential roles of the ancient viral sequences.

Marcia Tan, Ph.D., MPH, and her team at the University of Chicago Public Health Sciences Program are training community health workers in the greater Chicago area to conduct brief interventions encouraging tobacco cessation in low-income communities. Having more community health workers trained in tobacco cessation will increase the number of adults who receive help to quit smoking, which will help to reduce tobacco use and, ultimately cancer, among adults with low income.

Dr. Tan, a 2021 V Scholar, was interviewed on ESPN during the 2024 Jimmy V Classic to speak about her work and receiving a grant through the Stuart Scott Memorial Cancer Research Fund.

After working with her oncologists and going through treatment, Tammie feels great and is looking to make a difference.

As President and CEO of CJ Drilling and a Chicago native, Tammie chose to invest in cancer research by helping the V Foundation launch the <u>Chicago</u> <u>Epicurean in September 2024</u>. The inaugural event raised over \$2 million, with Tammie serving on the event committee and CJ Drilling being a sponsor. Tammie has seen the V Foundation at work and believes in the groundbreaking research that is being funded.

Paul Mansour will always remember June 22, 2024, as the exciting and bittersweet conclusion of a 22-year adventure. On that day, he ran the Anchorage Mayor's Marathon in Alaska, which marked the official completion of running a marathon in all 50 states. As he prepared for his "final dance," Paul rallied his friends, family and community to support this milestone race in a special way: honor one of his long-time inspirations, Jim Valvano, by raising money for lifesaving cancer research through the V Foundation for Cancer Research.

Paul joined Team V, the V Foundation's official endurance sports program, as a "Choose Your Own Race" participant, which allowed him to set up a personal fundraising page that shared his own story and motivation for "canceling cancer." Paul hopes his fundraiser, which surpassed \$10,000, will not only benefit early detection and treatments, but make a difference in eliminating the disease altogether for the next generation and beyond.

<u>The Glover family</u>—J.M. Glover, his son Matt Glover and Matt's wife Susan, and Matt and Susan's daughter Catherine Glover Frazier and her husband Eli Frazier are committed to leaving a legacy that mirrors Jim Valvano's. They may not be winning national championships, but they are accelerating Victory Over Cancer[®] in partnership with the V Foundation.

The mission of the V Foundation became personal to the Glover family in 2024. Just three months after Catherine and Eli welcomed their first son, Barrett, Eli noticed a lump on his neck. Further evaluation led to a diagnosis of Hodgkin's lymphoma. Eli, an NC State alumnus and inspired by Jim Valvano's "Don't Give Up . . . Don't Ever Give Up!"[®] motto, recently finished treatment and is doing well.

Our take on never giving up is not giving up because of our family. We're not going to give up because I'm not going to leave Catherine a widow. I'm not going to leave Barrett without a father. This is just our new reality, but it's a temporary reality at this point. **Our goal is to, as Jimmy V said, never give up and get through this.** - Catherine Glover

Because of their recent personal experience, their admiration of Jim Valvano and the V Foundation's mission of funding game-changing research, Catherine and Eli Frazier, Matt and Susan Glover, J.M. Glover and their multi-generational family business Glover Construction all came together to support the funding of a pediatric cancer research grant at St. Jude Children's Research Hospital. The grant, awarded to Mireya Velasquez, M.D., through the Dick Vitale Pediatric Cancer Research Fund, is focused on improving treatment options for children faced with blood cancers, such as lymphoblastic leukemia and lymphoblastic lymphoma.
