
How to watch Jake Paul vs Chavez Jr 2 live | fury vs usyk

21 seconds ago — The fight is officially on, Jake Paul and Julio Cesar Chavez Jr. both successfully made weight today at the cruiserweight limit, clearing the final hurdle ahead of their highly anticipated showdown. With tensions building and questions swirling around both fighters' credibility and motivation, the weigh in marked a crucial step toward what promises to be one of the most talked about bouts of the summer.



There was no struggle to make weight this time for Chavez Jr. who has had a history of missing weight, weighed in first at a career high of 198.4 pounds, 1.6 pounds under the cruiserweight limit of 200 pounds. In his last fight against MMA fighter Uriah Hall, Chavez (54-6-1, 34 KOs) weighed in at 197. 3 pounds.
