Zurdo Ramirez vs Yuniel Dorticos Live STreams Jake Paul Fight June 28, 2025

On the other hand, Dorticos will be aiming to cut off the ring and unleash his trademark power shots. If Ramirez gets drawn into a firefight, it could spell disaster — but if he sticks to his plan, he may be able to outlast the Cuban slugger.

Both men are former champions with something to prove. The winner could be on the fast track to another world title shot, while the loser may face serious questions about their future at the top level.
