Ireland U20 are set to face a physical and determined Georgia U20 side in what promises to be a key clash in the pool stages of the World Rugby U20 Championship. Ireland U20: Precision and Pace

Georgia U20: Grit, Power, and Passion

Georgia U20 continue to earn respect on the world stage thanks to their dominant forward pack and improving all-round game. Traditionally known for their scrummaging and mauling ability, the Junior Lelos are now adding depth to their attacking structure, with more confidence in spreading the ball when opportunities arise.

Captain Luka Tsirekidze leads a determined unit that thrives in tight, physical contests. For Georgia, success will depend on winning the collisions, slowing Ireland's ruck ball, and keeping errors to a minimum.

Key Matchup & Prediction

The battle at the breakdown will be crucial. Ireland's ability to generate quick ball is key to their expansive style, but if Georgia can disrupt the flow and slow the game down, they'll make life uncomfortable for the Irish side.

Prediction: Georgia will bring fire and intensity, but Ireland's superior cohesion and pace should see them pull away in the second half.

Verdict: Ireland U20 to win by 12 points, with a late flourish securing the result.
