UFC 317 brings fans a high-stakes flyweight title fight as reigning champion Alexandre Pantoja defends his belt against New Zealand's dangerous striker Kai Kara-France. Alexandre Pantoja (27-5) has quietly become one of the most dominant and respected names in the flyweight division. Kai Kara-France (25-11, 1 NC) returns to the title picture hungry and motivated. Representing New Zealand's City Kickboxing gym, Kara-France brings sharp technical striking, lightning-fast combinations, and legitimate knockout power—something rarely seen at flyweight. After a tough loss in an interim title bout against Brandon Moreno and a controversial decision defeat to Amir Albazi, he's back with renewed focus and the tools to shock the world. If he can keep the fight standing and control the pace, Kara-France could find success against the grappling-heavy champion.

This matchup is a classic striker vs. grappler clash. Pantoja will look to close the distance, apply pressure, and take the fight to the ground, where he can use his superior submission skills. Kara-France, meanwhile, will aim to manage distance, counter with precision, and punish Pantoja's entries with fast hands and powerful kicks.

For Pantoja, a win would further solidify his reign and prove he can beat all types of contenders. For Kara-France, it's a shot at redemption and a chance to become New Zealand's second-ever UFC champion after Israel Adesanya. With both men at the peak of their careers, the stakes couldn't be higher.
